


Another big clean up

Winter Survival Support Scheme

Winterton Care Campaign Group's Winter Survival Support Scheme for people over 60 who are vulnerable during the cold weather has gone from strength to strength.


We can provide eligible people with a Winter Survival kit. The kit contains a woolly hat, gloves and a foil blanket, all very useful to keep people warm in case the heating



stop functioning. Also in the kit, a small torch, some tea/coffee whiteners and soup packs along with a variety of useful Age UK leaflets.

People in receipt of a survival kit are also put on the list for snow clearing of their private paths to garages, sheds, bins and access to main footpath.

Our support team visits residents on the list and help with shopping if required and assistance with transport for medical appointments.



With a £3685 grant from the National Lottery we have been able to acquire a large amount of snow clearing equipment and protective clothing for snow clearers.

> Our aim is to make Winterton a place where older people will not fear the isolation of winter months. By reducing the possibility of falls we will save the NHS

money and the trauma associated with broken limbs for many.

Winterton Care Campaign Group continues to care for the safety and well being of elderly / vulnerable residents. We can now add to our Winter Support Scheme after receiving a £2000 grant from Efficiency North.
